Bradley Charles Cutter, 66, died peacefully Saturday December 24, 2016 at his home in Elkton, Maryland after a long illness. He leaves his wife of 42 years, Lillian (Shepherd); his son, Asher and wife Yee-Fan Sun; his daughter Savannah Livingston and husband Jeff; and his daughter Christen Corvington and husband John. Brad also leaves his five grandchildren, Fletcher, Beatrix, Oona, Damon and Eddie Arlene; his four siblings Candy Cares, Jeff, Chris and Darryl; and many other loving family members and friends. Brad was born in Winchester Massachusetts to Robert Cutter and Carolyn Dearington. He spent much of his childhood in Sudbury Massachusetts where he first learned to sail--one of his life-long passions. Brad was an avid photographer and cyclist. He loved Cape Cod, spent many of childhood summers in Wellfleet, and returned there often with his own children to enjoy fudge, root beer, and double chocolate ice cream. Brad always lived where he had access to water for his many sailboats. Over the years, he moored his boats in Lake Quannapowitt, Winthrop Harbor, Wellfleet Harbor, and the Elk River. Brad and Lily spent much of their life together traveling across North America, both in his tractor trailer and later in their camper. They both loved to drive quiet back roads, admiring occasional sightings of vintage cars, and Brad spent most of his working life as a professional driver. Brad thrived on spending time with his family, especially his grandchildren. He loved to teach them about the details of life and Yankee ingenuity, from how to properly enter a boat, set the table and load the dishwasher to how to be considerate and use polite manners.

Brad was consistently prepared for the unforeseen needs of others, always with a pocket knife at his hip and a spare piece of clothing for the person who needed it. Despite his purposefully straitlaced nature, he never took life too seriously and cracked jokes to the very end. A memorial service will be held in the future at a time convenient for his family.
