She planned yearly Halloween, Christmas, Easter parties and other events for the children and families who belonged to the American Legion Hall. She personally shopped for and wrapped all the presents.

When not serving her community Charlotte enjoyed time with her faithful furry companions Paige and Bruce, crafting, bingo, music (Rod Stewart and The Beach Boys were her favorites), traveling and sewing. When she was able, Charlotte would make Halloween costumes for those who needed one or just asked. She liked hanging out with friends at a local restaurant or American Legion Hall watching the Raven's or Orioles' games.

More than anything Charlotte loved her family. She would call, asking who was having the next family gathering. If nothing was being planned she would suggest someone "get to it". She never missed a birthday, birth, wedding or meaningful event in the lives of those she loved. Charlotte would call to check on family and friends no matter what was going on in her own life at the time. She always looked forward to her yearly trip to Ocean City, Maryland with her son Ryan and daughter-in-law Sara, whom she loved very much. Charlotte also loved and talked about her Grand-dog Britain and Grand-cat Hugo.
