Courtney Ann Campbell a registered nurse at The Johns Hopkins Hospital Pediatric Operating Room died of cancer on December 23, 2015; she was 50 years old. Born on October 23, 1965 in Cheverly Maryland, Courtney was the daughter of Stephanie Rambach Campbell, Douglas Campbell, and his wife Peggy Campbell. A 1983 graduate of Meade Senior High School and a 1986 graduate of MacQueen Gibbs Willis School of Nursing, Courtney was a pediatric operating room nurse since 1989. Courtney was truly a live wire; full of spunk, an artist and photographer with a huge zest for life and a strong commitment to children. Courtney photographed bands and musicians on tour across the country, and in 2010 she launched the website, Musicians Opposed to Bullying, and posted anti-bullying announcements that were recorded by the musicians for their fans. In addition to her parents, Courtney is survived by her brother, Jon Campbell, a sister Whitney Sybil Campbell-Heil, two step-brothers Ralph Morgan Jr, and Randall Morgan, and five nephews, one niece, and two great nieces.
