Dennis R. Kennedy (Mock) Born Sept 7, 1943 in St. Albans NY.

Shortly after Dennis was born , the Kennedys moved their family of 9 to a “farm” located in Limeport, Pa. , where Dennis spent his childhood. Adjacent to the farm is Limeport Baseball Stadium for which Dennis held fond memories of, even in his last days. He had name plates placed on the seats in the stadium for his parents and each of his siblings, which remain there today.

Dennis graduated from Southern Lehigh High School in 1961; thereafter, he joined the Army in 1962 and received an Honorable discharge. He went on to study Economics and received a Bachelor's Degree from Muhlenberg College, Allentown , Pa.

Dennis is survived by his loving wife of 55 years, Anona Kennedy; his children Ronald Kennedy, Lisa Stowers, Cynthia Balonis and Carolyn Kennedy; 8 amazing grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren.

Dennis joins his parents Rolland and Dorothy Kennedy; his brothers Craig and

Keith Kennedy; his sisters Pat and Lynn Kennedy; son James Kennedy and grandson Jesse Kennedy.
