She listened to the song in its entirety and her final words, "Londa, I will be Alright, Love you." It was then evident that Doris Elaine had made her peace with God and was ready for her transition.

Doris Elaine was a very intelligent, inquisitive and knowledgeable person. She was always active with learning and had a thirst for knowledge about a variety of subjects (religion, law, education, medicine, etc.) She had so much extensive knowledge and "know how" about life journey and was able to effectively counsel many through their personal challenges and hardships.

Doris Elaine was considered a genuine person who seemed to have never met a stranger in her life. She enjoyed meeting people and building friendships and relationships that would last forever.
