Despite his rough start in extremely poor, undesirable conditions, Jack's spirit was bright EVERY single day. He loved life and exuded that joy wherever he went. So much so that people would go out of their way to express how kind, polite, and wonderful he was.

Jack graduated from Walter Johnson High School in 2017 and then went on to its Career and College Preparatory Program which he graduated from in 2019.

Jack was an extremely hard worker. He worked at MOMS Organic Market for 5 years; a job and community that he absolutely cherished. Jack was extremely proud to move into a group home in Gaithersburg, MD in 2019 where he gained independence like "college kids." Unfortunately, the

pandemic changed everything and Jack moved home to Crownsville, MD where he took a job at Safeway. Jack and his twin Nick are icons at Safeway where they are widely admired for their hard work, humor, and fascinating conversations.

Jack loved Pokémon, Mario games, fishing, and all things skeletons. His room is like a museum. But the thing he loved the most was people – family, friends, colleagues, and complete strangers. If Jack met you, you were sure to be engaged in long conversations and viewing endless silly memes. His infectious smile is etched in the hearts of countless people.
