



Jerome Philip Faux

August 9, 1928 - July 29, 2023

Jerome (“Jerry”) Philip Faux, 94, of Columbia, Maryland, departed this life on July 29th, 2023. He passed away peacefully following a brief illness. Jerome was born on August 9, 1928, in Pennsylvania to Sam & Minnie Faux. He was the youngest of 11 children. He grew up during the depression and worked many different jobs to help support his mother. Following in his brothers’ footsteps, he joined the United States Army in January 1946. After serving tours in Korea, Vietnam, and Germany he retired from his service in 1968. From there he went to work for Giant Food and spent 22 years as a meat cutter before retiring in 1990.

He was married to the love of his life, Maria (nee Hindenberger), for over 65 years before her death in 2020. Together they raised six children: Philip, Audrey, George, Randolph, Norman, and Susanne. He is survived by five of them, along with their spouses, eight grandchildren and three great-grandchildren, in addition to many nephews, nieces and numerous friends and neighbors.

After his retirement from Giant Food, Jerome developed a knack for making stain glass art along with his wife and together they made several beautiful pieces, still enjoyed by their family today. He also enjoyed taking trips to visit relatives in Pennsylvania and Germany – as well as various reunions with his Army buddies. Before moving to an assisted living facility in Columbia, he was active in his community in Odenton with food drives, always taking time to make sure others were cared for.

A memorial service will be held at St. Bernadette's Catholic church in Severn, Maryland, on Thursday, August 17th at 11:00, followed by a lite reception in the church hall. Interment will be that afternoon at the Veterans Cemetery in Crownsville, Maryland. In lieu of flowers, the family asks that donations be made to their local Alzheimer's Association in his memory.
