Jonathan David Fava—affectionately known as “Bubba”—of Severna Park, Maryland, passed away peacefully on Sunday, May 10, 2026, at Hospice of the Chesapeake in Pasadena, Maryland. He was surrounded by his family and closest friend.

Born September 29, 1980, in Baltimore, Jon was the beloved son of James (Jim) and Donna Fava (née Neu). He grew up in Pasadena, where his love of the water and outdoors were fostered.
