Well, I bought one from her and for many of years thereafter as I decorated my Christmas tree I would think back to that day and remember all the laughter those little deer nuts brought to our workday. \nThat is just one of many great memories. Kass and I used to go to the LaFontaine Bleu on Wednesday nights for Country Line Dancing. That was always a fun night. And then there is the train trip to Atlantic City that was a lot of fun. On the way up there, Joe DeCoursey had Kass laughing so hard people were coming from other cars wanting to join in on the fun and laughter.\nIt didn't matter rather we were at work or out somewhere. If I was with Kass I was surely going to have a good time and lots of laughs. \nShe sure will be missed. She was a great lady and I'm glad to have known her.
