Margaret Lorraine Tudor, "Peggy", passed away on Saturday, August 5th at her home in Severna Park, Maryland. Her husband, "Bill", and oldest son, Mark, were at her side.

Peggy was born on 2 March, 1942, in Baltimore, Maryland. She was the daughter of the late John S. Kitchner and Helen Kathryn Jean (Ingersoll) Kitchner.
