Mary Theresa “Terry” Hogan, of Baltimore, Maryland, passed away on Thursday, February 4, 2021 at the age of 77. She is survived by her loving children, Ellen Edler-Ott (Rick Ott), and Sharon Edler (Michael Stopford), her grandson, Henry Stopford, brothers Michael Hogan and Thomas Hogan, and her dearly-loved nieces and nephews. She was predeceased by her beloved parents William Michael Hogan and Martha Ellen Hogan, brother, Timothy John Hogan, nephew, William Michael Hogan and best friend, Carolyn Nelka.

Terry grew up in the Bel Air/Edison neighborhood, attended St. Anthony's Elementary and went on to graduate from the Catholic High School Of Baltimore in 1961. She continued her studies as a young single mother, working during the day and taking classes at night, and in 1981, she earned her Masters of Public Health at Johns Hopkins. Terry spent much of her adult life working for Johns Hopkins, and it was from there that she retired in 2016 as Program Administrator for the STD/HIV Prevention Training Center at Johns Hopkins Bayview. When she wasn't working, she was singing and laughing, traveling the world, reading anything in her path and being an excellent friend and mother.

Terry will be remembered for her beautiful singing voice, crystal blue eyes, giving nature, easy laugh, boundless love, unshakable loyalty, generosity, passion for progressive politics, drive to serve, curiosity, empathy, insatiable

appetite for reading and learning, endless patience, unabashed hopefulness, love of travel and probably some of the worst cooking ever tasted.

May her memory be a blessing. No services are currently planned but the family will host a celebration of her life at a time when we can all gather and celebrate fully.
