Mary Ruth Frallic Kirouac, passed away peacefully on July 10, 2020, at the age of 96. She was a devoted wife, mother, grandmother, great grandmother, neighbor, and friend.

Ruth was born in Winston Salem, NC to Lonnie and Lola Wilhelm. Lonnie died at a very young age and she was raised in an orphanage.
