Milton Emson Crammer Jr. "Milt"; 77, of Pasadena, Maryland passed away Saturday July 1, 2017 surrounded by his wife and children. Milt was born September 15, 1939 in Trenton, New Jersey to Milton Emson Crammer and Isabella Louise Barlow. He is predeceased by his sister, Lillian. Milt is the father to 4 children, Tim, Ronlea (Matthew), Stephanie (Irvin) and Brian (Cindy), grandfather to 10 grandchildren and great grandfather to 3-year-old Quinn and 18-year-old Isaac. Milt married the love of his life, Cheryl Loch on June 7, 2001. Milt attended Rutgers University where he earned a degree in liberal arts. He served his country by joining the Navy in 1958 and received the "Conspicuous Gallantry Medal" in 1962. After his military service, he had his own TV repair shop and eventually worked for Best Buy till retirement. Besides his wife and children, Milt's passion and talent was music. He was an accomplished piano player and talented singer. He not only passed those talents to his children but he shared those talents with his extended family and community. He was part of the arts department in the Arundel Community College where he would participate in plays and musicals. He also sang at loved one's funerals, birthdays and was an invited guest at nursing facilities. Another passion of Milt's was "knowledge seeking". His home is filled with books from his elementary school years to his volumes of notes from his studies of the Bible, languages, political and world history. Milt loved to debate and exchange ideas on past and current events. Since the advent of social media, he often posted his ideas and thoughts of world and political

happenings and welcomed any feedback. Milt contributed to the community by assisting in feeding the less fortunate and contributing to the fire and police departments. Milt and Cheryl would also go to a low-income senior dwelling and cook a Thanksgiving meal to those residents who were not able to be with their family.
