Travis Bland Smith, 52, of Brandywine, Maryland, beloved son of Diane Burnette Smith and the late Thomas Smith, passed away on April 19, 2023, at the Hospice of the Chesapeake in Pasadena, Maryland, after a battle with heart failure.

In his senior year, he attended and graduated from Osborne High School in Manassas, Virginia.
