In his younger days, he was active and served at Our Lady of Sorrows Parish in Pasay City, Philippines. Victor is quiet but has a friendly nature. The latter would prove helpful in his sales and marketing career that took him all over the Philippines. His work also brought him to Taiwan for a couple of years, prior to him joining his family in the US. Not one to sit idle, he most recently worked full time at Maryland Live! Casino.
