She decorated all around your Urn with Trees, reindeer, flowers and mini lights. You looked pretty dressed up. Rick put the patch on top of your Urn that was won in the green room and has your prop for the pool stick sitting on the table beside you, I am sure you can see it. Of course, Austin is still sleeping with your mass card and the flyer We made for the guests at the Church to take home with them under his pillow. He even has laid your picture on a pillow and pulled a cover up to your chest so you don't get cold. He says he tucked you in! Autumn misses you also but she is the quiet one but Austin talks in a whisper to you all the time. \n\nJenn and I did open presents Christmas Day, I tried to make it almost normal, I fixed bacon eggs and biscuits and blared the Christmas music from the TV just like you always did— not really the same feeling though. The kids were sick with the flu and Covid so we just spent a quiet day with Mom and Rick. \n\nNew Years Eve, Rick was sick so he slept the night away, Jenn spent the night at Stephanie's and I watched Virgin River. I did not go out to bang on the pots like I always do, just not the same again without you. \n\nI spend time talking to you and kidding around about not putting steak in your Urn, sometimes I just think about our life together for 49 years, stare at the Urn and wonder if you are going to walk in the door as if you have been on vacation without me, other times I just wonder why this had to happen to you. I am grateful you went quickly and did not suffer, I understand Leukemia is very hurtful to the person and the family. I never wanted you to suffer and I do understand why you chose to slip off into Gods hands after Jenn and I left the hospital. I just wish you would have told Jenn how much you loved her before you left this world, she is still having a hard time with not hearing you say you loved her. \n\nMost of both of our families have been really supportive and I thank them for it. Jenn has been a huge help to me, I know it is hard for her to be back home but she is handling it well. \n\nHow is our families doing? I wish you could give me a sign that everyone is

“look at that ass”. I blushed and was annoyed at the same time but wanted to get to know all about you.
I had been standing on the sideline talking to this girl I did not know and was telling her how cute you were and I wanted to go out with you. Those bright blue-grey eyes caught my attention so quickly (I am an eye person). She laughed and said to me,
“That’s my brother.” I was so embarrassed as I was telling her all about

“WORLD OF WARCRAFT” and just visiting with family and friends, sharing holidays with our families, going on our first Cruise for Jennifer and Shannon 16th birthdays, many summer trips to Ocean City, Water Country and Bush Gardens, you coaching and attending Jennifer and Shannon’s soft ball games, attending Tennis games, College football games, both graduations at East Carolina University, going to the Ravens and Orioles games with Jennifer and many more events for the family. Your last Trip was to New Orleans to visit with your brother, niece and nephew and seeing you great nephews for the first time, and much more.
You loved your daughter above all else. You loved our families and would do anything within your ability for them.

Nothing was too much trouble for you to do for your family and friends. Even when you did not feel well, you pushed on until you could no longer push yourself. \n\nI am still waiting for you to walk in the front door. It does not feel real that you will not be coming home. When I left the hospital that night, you said to me when I bent over to kiss you, \"you know I am not coming out of here\". It broke my heart to hear you say that. You then closed your eye and would not talk to me anymore. I said goodnight and I would see him in the morning and went home. At 10:33 pm you flatlined and the doctor called me with the bad news about 1150 pm. and he said he passed in his sleep peacefully. My heart told me you were very ill but I did not see this coming so soon. \ni would have never of left your side.
